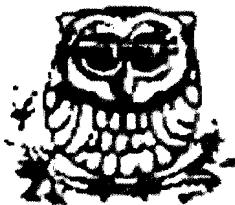

PIERCE COLLEGE

Absolutely Free!

How often have you seen this claim offering you something for nothing? If your experience matches mine, perhaps too many times to count! Most people are understandably skeptical about such assertions. Pierce College, however, does offer wonderful life-long educational opportunities for older adults at no cost. Each semester thousands of your neighbors enroll in our ENCORE/OASIS program offering noncredit classes without required texts, exams, or term papers to write. The variety of choices is incredible, ranging from art and music appreciation to learning how to use the internet. Programs in humanities, wellness, literature, physical education are also offered, along with many more opportunities for personal growth and development. There are even stimulating lecture series attended by hundreds. And, except for a very few classes charging a small materials fee, all these courses are truly absolutely free to the community. The ENCORE/OASIS Spring Schedule of Classes is now available and registration is open. To receive a schedule and more information, just call 710-2561.

Of course, Pierce College has over 20,000 other students who benefit from low-fee (but not "absolutely free!") academic courses. Enrollment competition for some offerings is so intense that our campus has initiated a program guaranteeing students a spot in high demand English and Math classes. When a class fills, we simply create another. Students are able to take the course they need and are not turned away. This experimental "class on demand" program is being undertaken on a pilot basis only during our current winter intersession

but is proving very popular. Our English 101 student enrollments, for example, have increased over 200% compared to last year's intersession. Depending upon funding availability, we may be able to expand this successful free-up-a-section program to future semesters.

As all of us at Pierce College are well aware, education is not free of expense. Your tax dollars support Pierce's programs and ensure that the local community can access the many academic opportunities available on our campus. On February 5th Californians will have a chance to voice their opinions on a number of ballot measures. Before voting, I hope you will review Proposition 92, which is designed to stabilize community college funding without raising taxes. Although this proposal has not received the media exposure afforded to all the presidential hopefuls who are vying for attention, it is a measure that will significantly benefit Pierce College. As with all elections, please be sure to exercise your freedom to express your opinions via the ballot box.

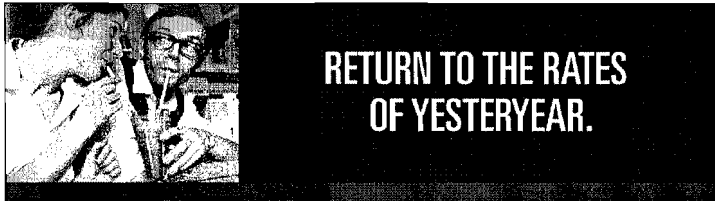
